Greetings Aurora Families,

As announced by Superintendent, Mr. Ian Gray, the school structure is going to change this coming school year. The current Elementary School and Middle School will be one school and will be called the Aurora Academic Charter Primary School (AACPS) from grades Kindergarten to 7 at the Sherbrooke Campus. The grade 8's will join the grades 9, 10, and 11 at the St. Patrick Campus (as it is currently called) as the Aurora Academic Charter Secondary School (AACSS).

This change is planned for long-term growth of our school district and provides exciting new changes and opportunities with combined resources. The Primary School is growing by adding new kindergarten classes and an additional class into each grade 5, and 6, and 7. This allows more families the opportunities to join our community.

Although the name may change slightly, the daily operations of the school remain the same. We remain committed to the same academic standards and expectations as we always have, seeking to achieve the same school Values, Mission, and Vision. We will still deliver the same rigorous academic programming that Aurora is known for.

Change can sometimes cause some concerns but, together we are stronger. So we ask that parents continue to support our program and the many things about Aurora that makes it a great place to learn. This includes being active in our school events. I look forward to seeing you all at a future school event.

Final Exam Absence policy: <u>AR 6170 Section 2</u>

-Should a student leave early for summer break and miss any Final Exams, the student may NOT write any exams early before departure.

- A missed Final Exam will be given a grade of "UA" (Unable to Assess) and the final course mark will be the average of the three terms.

Grade 6 Provincial Achievement Tests (PATs):

Grade 6 students will be writing the Provincial Achievement Tests (PATs) in the four core subjects at the end of June. They are mandatory tests that we use for final exams. 










Canada Wide Science Fair finalists win Bronze!

STUDENT AWARDS

The changes to the distribution of Awards in the Middle School are presented below and will supersede any previously published description and criteria for the Awards.

Term Awards will be given as follows for Grade 5 and higher:

• Outstanding Citizenship: One per class and the recipients will be selected by the teachers.

• Diligence: One per class and the recipients will be selected by the teachers.

• Honor Roll: Any student who achieves an average of 80% or higher in the 4 core subjects. Students must not have anything lower than 75% (or a "B") in any subject.

• Honors with Distinction: Any student who achieves an average of 90% or higher in the 4 core

subjects. Students must not have anything lower than 75% (or a "B") in any subject.

The following award will be a year-end award only:

• Principal's Award for overall academics, leadership, citizenship, and sportsmanship will be given to

one individual in grade 6 only. The recipient will be selected by the teachers of that grade. **This will be the final year that this award is given**.

Conditions:

• Any student on Extended Leave during that Term is ineligible for an award and Honor Roll in that Term, but is still eligible for awards in the other Terms.

• Any student having an Extended Absence in ANY term is ineligible for the Principal Award if applicable.

• Any student with a "UA" as a report card grade in any subject is ineligible for any awards that term, including Honor Roll, Honors With Distinction, and the Principal's Award if applicable.

• Any student who misses a Final Exam in June is ineligible for the Principal's Award if applicable.

• All awards and Honor Roll is at the discretion and approval of the Principal.

Extended Absence Policy and how it affects Awards Eligibility::

An Extended Absence is a non-medical absence from school for 5 or more consecutive school days (family holiday, visits, funeral, weddings, other events, etc.). The parents are to first contact the principal well before the trip to discuss this. An Extended Absence form will be provided to the student only after the parents discuss this with the principal. Extended Absences have academic consequences for the student as indicated in policy <u>AR 6130 Section</u> <u>G</u> and <u>AR 6170 Section 1</u>.

The Term 3 Awards Ceremony will take place virtually on Friday, June 23rd at 2:30pm.
Honor Roll, Honors with Distinction, Academic, and Character Awards recipients' names will be posted on the wall outside the office.
